What is the Junior Leader Club?

The Junior Leader Club (JLC) is the next level of 4-H club for senior level 4-H members. We are available for anyone who is interested in becoming involved at the county, district, and state level. We complete community service projects and leadership projects throughout the year.

Who can join JLC?

Anyone enrolled in 4-H who is 13-18 years old is encouraged to join. You must be enrolled in at least one project.

When does JLC meet?

We meet on the last Monday of every month except August, when we don't meet, and November, when we combine it with the December meeting. Meetings in January, March, May, July, and October are at the McKee Building at the Ranch. The February, April, June, September, and December meetings are at the Extension Office

What is expected of a JLC member?

Members are required to attend 7 meetings and be on at least one committee. We also recommend members participate in club activities.

What events does JLC host?

We host Dairy Bar and Officer Training. Dairy Bar takes place every year in the McKee building during the county fair. Office Training is held in October prior to our monthly meeting.

What other events does JLC participate in?

Many of our members help with Achievement Night in November, running food booths at events like Live-stock Field Day, and announcing the door prize winners at the 4-H Carnival.



What scholarships does JLC offer?

Our club encourages attendance to Colorado State 4-H events and National events by offering scholarships to help with attendance fees. There are also college scholarships available for graduating seniors who are members of the club. More scholarship information is available on the Larimer County Extension website as well as the scholarship applications.

JLC is an amazing way to make more friends. We have bonding activities and get to know each other very well at meetings and at events. By going to conferences, you can make life long friends with 4-Hers from our county and many different parts of the state.

What are the levels of 4-H?

4-H Club: Club officer and project participation.

County: JLC is where you represent the county by supporting (financially) county participation at 4-H district and state events.

District: District II is a culmination of Boulder, Weld and Larimer County representatives offering leadership experiences and serves as a gateway to state officer roles.

State: Selects representation for national conferences and events in Washington D.C. and Atlanta, GA

The JLC can open the door for many opportunities in higher levels of 4-H.
