Name the AKC Dog Group whose breeds were developed for serving humans by pulling sleds, carts, performing water rescues, and guarding property and livestock.

A. Working

What type of scissors would be best to use in trimming excess hair from a dog's pads?

A. Blunt ended scissors

Q5.

Why should you brush all tangles and mats from a dog's coat before bathing it?

A. Water will make the mats tighter and harder to get out

Q6.

What is the name of the coat type that has a hard, coarse and wiry texture?

A. Wirehaired or Broken

What is the most important nutrient you can provide to your dog?

A. Water

What is the term called when you pose your dog in the show ring without using your hands?

A. Free Stacking
